Active Threat Crisis Phase Management Techniques & Tactics
For Police & Fire First Responding Supervisors

Northeastern Illinois Public Safety Training Academy – Glenview, IL.

This new 8-hour course is a collaborative training program taught by police and fire instructors that is designed to bring law enforcement and fire service operational leadership together to focus on techniques and tactics utilized at the onset of an Active Shooter Incident (ASE). This class is specifically designed for the first line supervisors, the “boots on the ground” operational commanders for both fire and police departments. It will provide nationally recognized best practices and strategies regarding the initial command structure and management, deployment and utilization of Rescue Task Forces during active threat critical incidents.

This course should be attended by Police & Fire Department Battalion Chiefs, Shift Chiefs, Incident Commanders, Police Sergeants, Lieutenant, Shift Commanders or any other command staff who might be present at the onset of an ASE. This class is designed for those who will arrive first and responsible for the initial tactical response and the formation of the incident command structure. We highly recommend that representatives from the police and fire departments covering the same jurisdiction attend together. This is a unified operational concept where “first on the scene” supervisors should be working cohesively to stop the killing and treat victims as quickly as possible.

The course will allow police and fire operational supervisors the opportunity to work in partnership and practice the operational skills sets required to manage this type of an event in a classroom setting. Real world examples, simulations and tabletop exercises will be utilized to practice the communication, operational skill sets and coordination required to manage the deployment of Contact Teams, Rescue Task Forces and follow-on support personnel.
